

*Panel is a priority for implementation of PCN Evolution.
In order to achieve this priority panel needs to
be identified at the individual physician level,
and regularly confirmed by the patient.*

**PCN Evolution Panel Goal for 2014-15;
Each PCN will have 80% of their physicians
with panel identification processes in use.**

*Panel based care is a progression
of panel identification followed by panel management.*

Panel Identification includes 2 components:

- The patient record accurately indicates the most responsible physician. This should be confirmed by the patient on a regular basis.
- The team can generate a list of active patients attached to the physician. This panel list should be reviewed and updated on a regular basis.

Panel Management includes 2 components:

- patient/disease registries are available to support care planning activities
- reports on care processes or outcome of care are regularly provided as feedback to practice teams for their review.

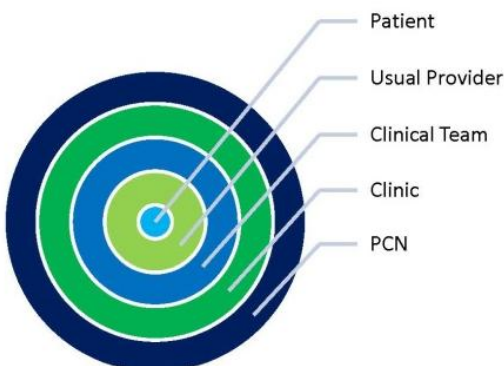


Diagram 1: Patient Attachment at Multiple Levels

Panel at Multiple Levels

Panel at the physician/team level strengthens relationships and drives patient care planning and enhanced interactions.

Panel at the clinic level is the sum of physician/team panels and supports service delivery planning (ie. team roles and responsibilities and specific program offerings) of the clinic.

Primary care network panels are the sum of physician/team or clinic panels. PCN level panel planning allows for more comprehensive program support planning.
